



- The additional \$27 million in WIA funds will be made available in grants later this year to serve workers displaced from their jobs.

The stimulus funds will nearly double the amount of WIA funds the federal government allocated to California for the current fiscal year. In 2008-09, the state received \$427 million in regular WIA funding to provide workforce development services. The state hopes to see an even bigger allocation next fiscal year to help meet the growing demand for employment services, in addition to the federal stimulus funds.

The amount of WIA stimulus funds going to local WIBs will be based primarily on the unemployment rate in the area, along with other economic factors. The stimulus funds are intended to encourage boards to partner with employers and other organizations to provide further job training opportunities.

Specifically, the federal government emphasizes priority for training in high demand occupations, including infrastructure construction, health care and green industries. In addition, the funds should help bolster the availability of core and intensive services, ranging from one-on-one job counseling to workshops helping workers assess and improve their skills and identify good job opportunities.

California is receiving these funds in addition to a separate stream of federal stimulus funding for the UI program.
